Course overview:

- An opportunity to explore some of the challenges to doing quality improvement work in health services.
- A guided, participatory, journey through the Model for Improvement, using a widely relatable case study from primary care which explores the challenges of trying to improve access to health checks for people with a learning difficulty.
- An introduction to the interface between 'Patient Safety', 'Human Factors', and Quality Improvement.
- Understanding when and how to use behaviour change approaches (such as the ABC Toolkit) within quality improvement work.
- An introduction to the Improvement Academy quality improvement Project Template which you can use to plan your own quality improvement project.

NOTE: pre-course and 'homework' videos and exercises form an integral part of the course content and individuals must schedule time to complete these between sessions.
